Data and Data Analysis



1. Record the speed of a cars driving down the street.

Measure the distance between 2 objects that are more than 10 m apart, such as telephone poles. Convert this distance to kilometres. Example: $15 \text{ m} \div 1000 \text{ km} = 0.015 \text{ km}$

For 10 cars, measure the time it takes to travel between the poles. Convert each of these times into hours. Example: 10 s \times 0.000277 h = 0.00277 h

 $1 s = 0.0002\overline{7} h$

Find the speed of each car by dividing the distance by the time. Your speed will come out in km/h. Write your data in a table. Example: $d \div t$

$$= 0.015 \div 0.00277$$

= 5.4 km/h
