Manteo A look behind the scenes at this Outer Banks town

anteo is perhaps best known for being the home of the first American-born English child. Or of Andy Griffith. Or of the "Lost Colony."

However, it's also the home to a couple thousand permanent residents who live in and work on the 8-mile long, 2-mile wide island.

Jeff Floyd, a resident of Nagshead, works out of Manteo taking tourists out fishing on the open waters of the Atlantic Ocean.

"I've been doing this for a little over a year now, and I love it. Fishing is just something that gets in your blood."

It has served as the training ground for more than 5,000 actors and technicians, including such famous personalities as Andy Griffith and Terrance Mann.
