

7.2 CUTOUTS AND WRAPAROUNDS

DIRECTIONS: Harrower advises that designers wanting to use cutouts in a design first respect the photograph, using cutouts on feature photos and photos with crisp, dark edges. In chapter 7, he says, "Crude cutouts look amateurish." Below is a photo taken against a light-colored background for the express purpose of becoming a cutout. For this exercise, find your own photo suitable for becoming a cutout and practice using Adobe Photoshop's Extract filter (or similar function). Then place it on a page and practice creating a text wrap with dummy text wrapping around the art.







Start with a suitable photo.

Using Adobe Photoshop's Extract filter, or similar function, knock out the background.

Place the cutout on the page and use the Text Wrap function to wrap some dummy text around the cutout.
