Exercise 9-14

Set margins for an entire document and for selected text by using the Page Setup dialog box.

- 1. Open the file **Gresh**.
- 2. Change the margins for the entire document by following these steps:
 - a. Click the Page Layout tab, and click the Margins button \(\begin{aligned} \] .
 - b. Click Custom Margins, and set the Top margin to 2 inches, the Bottom margin to .75 inch, and the Left and Right margins to 1.25 inches. Click OK.
- 3. Change the margins, and create a new section for selected text by following these steps:
 - a. Select the text that begins "Campbell's Confections." through "Fax: 304-555-6660."



- b. Open the Page Setup dialog box.
- c. Set the left and right margins to 2 inches.
- d. Choose **Selected text** from the **Apply to** drop-down list, and click **OK**. The address appears by itself on a new page.




- 4. Click the Undo button **5** to undo the new section.
- 5. Key the text Matthew Garrett, Manager as a separate line before "Campbell's Confections" in the body of the letter.
- 6. Save the document as *[your initials]***9-14** in your Lesson 9 folder.
- 7. Submit and close the document.

Set margins in Print Layout view and Print Preview and change orientation.

- 1. Open the file Chocolate.
- 2. Change the left and right margins in Print Layout view by following these steps:



a. Click the Print Layout View button located on the right of the status bar.



- c. Using the horizontal ruler, position the pointer on the left margin boundary until it becomes a two-pointed horizontal arrow (and the ScreenTip "Left Margin" appears).
- d. Hold down [Att] and drag the margin boundary until the left margin measures 1.5 inches.
- e. Position the pointer on the right margin boundary and use the same method to drag it to 1.5 inches.
- 3. Change the top margin in Print Preview by following these steps:
 - a. Click the Microsoft Office Button. Click the arrow beside Print, and click Print Preview.
 - b. If the rulers are not displayed, click to select the Show Ruler command.
 - c. Using the vertical ruler, position the pointer on the top margin boundary until it becomes a two-pointed arrow.
 - d. Hold down [Att] and drag the top margin boundary to 2 inches.
 - e. Click the Close Print Preview button butt
- 4. Add a bold, centered, and uppercase title **TYPES OF CHOCOLATE** to the top of the document, with 24 points spacing after.
- 5. Change the orientation to landscape by following these steps:
 - a. Open the Page Setup dialog box.
 - b. Click the Margins tab and choose Landscape.



- c. Change the top margin to 2 inches, change the bottom margin to 1 inch, and change the left and right margins to 1.25 inches.
- d. Click OK to close the Page Setup dialog box.
- 6. Save the document as *[your initials]*9-15 in your Lesson 9 folder.
- 7. Submit and close the document.

Set mirror and gutter margins.

- 1. Open the file Corporate Gifts 2.
- 2. Use the Page Setup dialog box to set mirror and gutter margins by following these steps:
 - a. Open the Page Setup dialog box.
 - b. Choose Mirror margins from the Multiple pages drop-down list.
 - c. Change the inside and outside margins to 1.5 inches.
 - d. Set the Gutter margin to .5 inch.
 - e. Click OK.
- 3. Scroll through the document in Print Layout view to see the new margin settings.
- 4. Switch to Print Preview.

Two Pages



- 5. Click the Two Pages button to see both pages display with the new margin settings. Click the Close Print Preview button .
- 6. Save the document as *[your initials]*9-16 in your Lesson 9 folder.
- 7. Print the document two pages per sheet, by following these steps:
 - a. Click the Microsoft Office Button.
 - b. Click **Print** to open the Print dialog box.
 - c. Click the drop-down arrow beside the Pages per sheet option and choose 2 pages.
 - d. Click OK.
- 8. Submit and close the document.

Exercise 9-17

Set print options, print an envelope, and print labels.

- 1. Open the file **WV Stores**.
- 2. Print a portion of the document by following these steps:
 - a. Select the text for the "Wheeling, WV" store—from "Campbell's Confections" through the fax number.
 - b. Press Ctrl + P to open the Print dialog box.
 - c. Choose Selection and click OK.

- 3. Insert the date by following these steps:
 - a. Go to the end of the document, and press Enter four times. Key the text **Updated** and press Spacebar.
 - b. Click the Insert tab, and click Date and Time.
 - c. Choose the fourth date format, make sure **Update automatically** is not checked, and click **OK**.
 - d. Insert a blank line after the date.
 - 4. Prepare an envelope addressed to the Morgantown store by following these steps:
 - a. Select the name and address lines for the Morgantown store. Do not select the telephone and fax numbers.
 - b. Click the Mailings tab. Click the Envelopes button. Click the Envelopes tab.
 - c. In the **Delivery address** box, delete the comma in the address, and key **-3301** at the end of the ZIP Code.
 - d. In the **Return address** box, key your name, followed by the office address:

Campbell's Confections 25 Main Street Grove City, PA 16127

- 5. Choose additional envelope options, and add the envelope to the document by following these steps:
 - a. Click the **Options** button and choose the **Envelope Options** tab, if it is not already displayed.
 - b. Make sure the envelope size is 10.
 - c. Click the **Font** button for the Delivery Address. Change the format to bold and all caps and click **OK**.
 - d. Click OK in the Envelope Options dialog box. Click Add to Document in the Envelopes and Labels dialog box. Do not save the return address as the default.
- 6. Prepare the printer for a standard business envelope (or feed a blank sheet of paper into the printer). Print the document (envelope included).
- 7. Save the document as *[your initials]*9-17a in your Lesson 9 folder.
- 8. Create and print a page of return address labels by following these steps:
 - a. With the insertion point in section 1 (the envelope), open the Envelopes and Labels dialog box and click the Labels tab.
 - b. Check the **Use return address** box. (Word recognizes the return address you previously entered for the envelope.)
 - c. Choose the option Full page of the same label.
 - d. Click Options. Set the Product number to 5160 and verify that Page Printer and Avery US Letter are selected. Click OK.
 - e. Click **New Document** to save the labels as a separate document. Do not save the return address as the default.
 - f. Save the labels as *[your initials]*9-17b in your Lesson 9 folder.
 - g. Print the labels on a blank sheet of paper.
- 9. Close both documents.

Because this document contains many addresses, you need to select the text you want to appear in the **Delivery** address box of the Envelopes and Labels dialog box.

- 1. Open the file **PA Stores**.
- 2. At the beginning of the document, key the text shown in Figure 9-17, including the corrections. Use single spacing, and insert one blank line between paragraphs.

- 4. Using the Page Setup dialog box, set the top margin to 2 inches and the left and right margins to 1.25 inches.
- 5. Select the text beginning with the second title "Pennsylvania Stores" through the end of the document. Use the Page Setup dialog box to change the left and right margins for *only* the selected text to 3 inches.
- 6. Change the top margin of the new section to 1.5 inches.

- 7. Format all occurrences of "Campbell's Confections" in the second section as bold italic.
- 8. Save the document as *[your initials]*9-18 in your Lesson 9 folder.
- 9. Print the document using the 2 Pages per sheet option in the Print dialog box. Close the document.

Set margins for a document and for selected text, change page orientation, and set print options.

- 1. Open the file Memo 3.
- 2. Insert today's date in the date line.
- 3. In the opening paragraph of the memo, replace the text "items below" with following information.
- 4. Change the top margin to 2 inches and the left and right margins to 1.25 inches.
- 5. Select the text from "Beginning next quarter" through the end of the document. Change the orientation to landscape.
- 6. Format the new section as follows: change the top margin to 1.5 inches, change the bottom margin to 1 inch, and change the left and right margins to 1 inch.
- 7. Place a blank line above "Description/Model number." Delete the paragraph mark after "Model Number," and insert a tab character. Delete the paragraph mark after "Serial Number," and insert a tab character. Continue this procedure until the line includes all items. Adjust the tab settings to distribute the text evenly between the margins. Change the font of the headings to Arial Narrow, and apply bold and small caps formatting. Apply a bottom border to the headings.
- 8. Save the document as *[your initials]*9-19 in your Lesson 9 folder.
- 9. Print the document two pages per sheet. Close the document.

Exercise 9-20

Set margins, set mirror and gutter margins, and address an envelope.

- 1. Open the file **Orders**.
- 2. Change the left and right margins to 1.25 inches.

- 3. Set mirror margins and a .5-inch gutter margin.
- 4. Format the title as 14-point bold with a shadow effect. Add 72 points of paragraph spacing before the title.
- 5. Justify all text below the title except the tabbed information.
- 6. Go to the end of the document, and key a colon after "at" in the last sentence. Place each line of the company address on a separate line, and delete the commas after "Confections" and "Street" and the period after the ZIP Code. Format the address with 1.5-inch left and right indents, a 1-point box border, and gray shading.
- 7. Add an envelope to the document, using the company address. Use your name and address as the return address. Do not save the return address.
- 8. Select the paragraph headings beginning with "Online" through "Customer Service," and change the font size to 12 points. Do not change the font size for the paragraphs beginning with "Note."
