### Exercise 3-23


Add text, rearrange slides, add sections, and delete slides.


1. Open the file **Resort**.
2. On slide 1, replace “Student Name” with *[your name]*.
3. On slide 2, change the title “Customer Requirements” to **Vacationer’s Expectations**.
4. On slide 3, insert a new bulleted line after the first bullet point, and key **Our name associated with gourmet dining**.
5. On slide 4, key the following text into the blank body text placeholder:

**Miami Beach**  
**Palm Springs**  
**Niagara Falls**

6. Reverse the position of slides 2 and 3 by following these steps:
  - a. On the Slides and Outline pane, click the Slides tab.





**NOTE**


If the Slides and Outline pane is not displayed, click the Normal view button  to display it.

- b. Position your pointer on the right border of the Slides tab, and drag the splitter bar to the right to enlarge the slide thumbnails.
  - c. Click the slide 3 thumbnail to select it.
  - d. Drag slide 3 up so it is between slides 1 and 2.
  - e. Release your mouse button.
7. Reverse the position of slides 5 and 6.
8. Add and rename a section by following these steps:
  - a. Select slide 1 on the Slides tab.
  - b. From the Home tab, in the Slides group, click the Section button , and choose **Add Section**.
  - c. Right-click the section title “Untitled Section,” and choose **Rename Section**.
  - d. Key **Resort Presence**, and click **Rename**.
9. On slide 6, add another section called **Strengths**.
10. Delete slide 7 “Key Benefits”.
11. Move to slide 1, and save the presentation as *[your initials]3-23* in your Lesson 3 folder.
12. Close the presentation and submit your work.

## Exercise 3-24


**Rearrange slides; use cut, copy, duplicate, and paste; use undo; and check spelling.**

1. Open the file **EatingGuide**.
2. Duplicate slide 1 by following these steps:
  - a. Select slide 1 on the Slides tab.
  - b. From the Home tab, in the Clipboard group, click the down arrow on the Copy button , and choose **Duplicate**.
3. Press **Ctrl+Z**, the keyboard shortcut for Undo, to remove this duplicated slide.
4. On slide 3 “Basic Food Groups” select the text “Use sparingly,” and from the Home tab, in the Clipboard group, click the Cut button .
5. Move to slide 7, and paste the copied text by using the following steps:
  - a. Click the I-beam pointer in the body text placeholder after “Sweets.”
  - b. Press **Enter** two times.
  - c. From the Home tab, in the Clipboard group, click the Paste button .
6. On the Home tab, in the Paragraph group, click the Decrease List Level button  so that “Use Sparingly” is even with the word “Examples.”

7. On the Slide tab, drag slide 10 below slide 3.
8. Check spelling in the presentation using the following steps:
  - a. Move to slide 1. From the Review tab, in the Proofing group, click the Spelling button .
  - b. Make corrections as needed, and click **OK** when the spelling check is complete.
  - c. Move to slide 1, and save the presentation as *[your initials]3-24* in your Lesson 3 folder.
9. Close the presentation and submit your work.

### Exercise 3-25






Use the Undo command, apply a design theme, change theme colors, and add a handout footer.

1. Start a new blank presentation.
2. Apply a design theme by using the following steps:
  - a. From the Design tab, in the Themes group, click the More button .
  - b. Click the **Verve** design theme to apply it to the presentation.
3. On slide 1, key **Smart Diet Options** for the presentation title. Key **Choosing Low-Fat Foods** for the subtitle.
4. Insert a new slide with the **Two Content** layout.
5. Key the title for slide 2 (on two lines) and bulleted text for slide 2 that are shown in Figure 3-22, increasing the list level for bulleted text below “Under” and “Over” as shown.
6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 to create slide 3.

7. View the presentation as a slide show, starting on slide 1. Return to Normal view when you're finished.
8. Change the design theme: From the Design tab, in the Themes group, click the More button ; then click the **Concourse** theme.
9. Change theme colors: From the Design tab, in the Themes group, click the Colors button ; then click **Opulent**.
10. Click the Undo button  to compare the new color scheme with the previous one.
11. Click the Redo button  to reapply the color change.
12. Check spelling in the presentation.
13. Create a Notes and Handouts footer: From the Insert tab, in the Text group, click the Header and Footer button . On the Notes and Handouts tab, make these adjustments:
  - a. Check **Date and time**, and choose **Update automatically**.
  - b. Check **Footer**, and key *[your initials]3-25* in the Footer text box.
  - c. Make sure **Page number** is checked.
  - d. Click **Apply to All**.
14. Move to slide 1, and save the presentation as *[your initials]3-25* in your Lesson 3 folder.
15. Close the presentation and submit your work.

### Exercise 3-26

**Add headers and footers, change the theme colors, apply a slide transition, and modify effect settings.**


1. Open the file **Takeout**.
2. On slide 1, replace "Student Name" with your name.
3. Add a transition effect by following these steps:
  - a. From the Transitions tab, in the Transition to This Slide group, click the More button . In the Exciting category, select **Dissolve**.
  - b. From the Transitions tab, in the Timing group, click the Sound list arrow, and choose **Cash Register**.
  - c. Click the up arrow on the Duration box to increase the time of the transition by one .05-second increment to **01:25 seconds**.
  - d. From the Transitions tab, in the Timing group, click the Apply to All button .

4. Add a slide footer and numbers: From the Insert tab, in the Text group, click the Header and Footer button . On the Slide tab, make these adjustments:
  - a. Check **Slide number**.
  - b. Check **Footer**, and key your name.
  - c. Click **Don't show on title slide** so that the footer and slide number do not print on slide 1.
  - d. Click **Apply to All**.
5. Move to slide 2, and notice that with this theme the footer shows at the top of the slide.
6. Create a handout header and footer; include the date, your name as the header, the page number, and *[your initials]3-26* as the footer.
7. Save the presentation as *[your initials]3-26* in your Lesson 3 folder.
8. View all the slides as a slide show.
9. Close the presentation and submit your work.

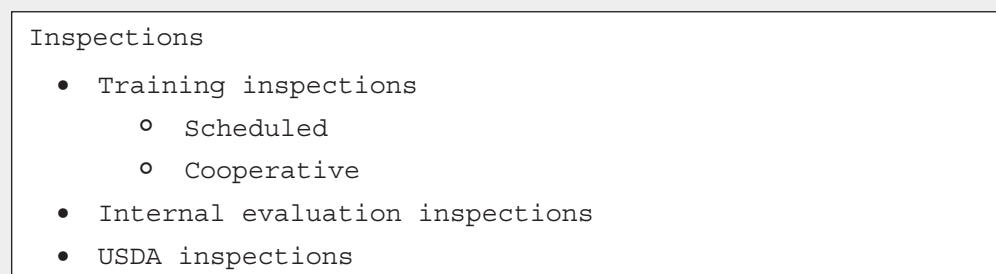
1. Open the file **FoodSafety**.

4. Edit text and increase the list level for the bulleted items as shown in Figure 3-23.

3. Select the thumbnails for slides 2 “Introduction”, 7 “Real Life”, and 8 “What This Means”.
4. Delete the selected slides.
5. Use the **Replace** command to replace each occurrence of the word “Topic” with the word “Item.” Use the **Match case** and **Find whole words only** options so that you replace only “Topic” and not “Topics” or “topic.”

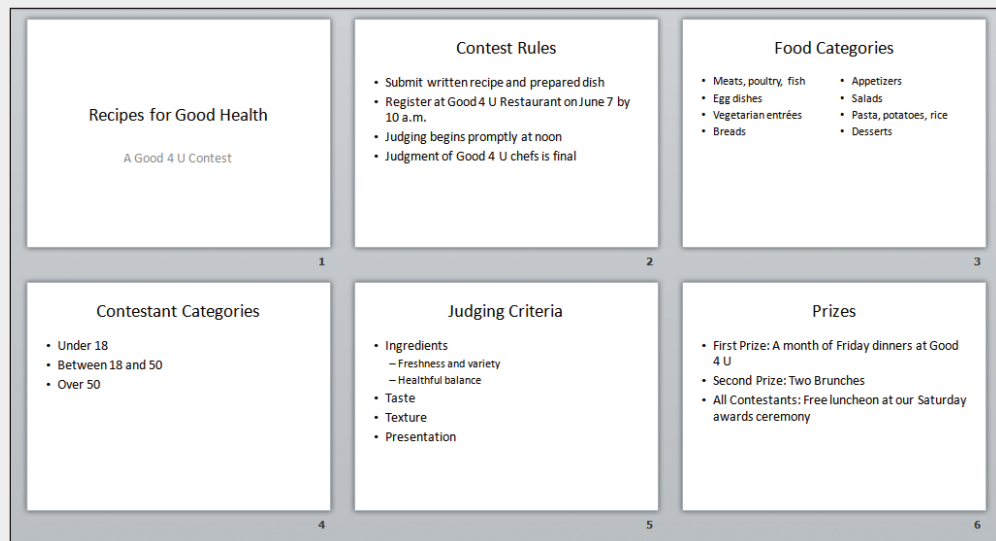

### Exercise 3-31

Imagine that you are organizing a fund-raiser for your local community college to raise money for an updated technology for the business department. ### Exercise 3-32

## Exercise 3-33

The owner of a bookstore has decided to increase traffic by hosting a book-reading or author-signing day based on a children's story. Choose a children's story, for example, a Dr. Seuss classic, *Berenstain Bears*, or *Frog and Toad's adventures*. Create a presentation that promotes the event. This presentation will be given at school reading nights to encourage parents to bring their children to the event. Include the title of the book and the author's name. Describe the event, and include small details of the story to increase interest. Rearrange slides as necessary to get them in a logical order. Choose a design theme and theme colors that convey the mood of the book and event. Add transition effects. Add page numbers to the slides. Check the spelling in the presentation.
