AutoCAD Problems

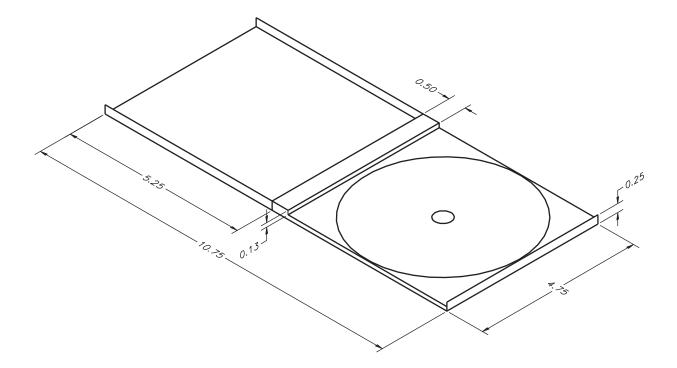
In AutoCAD, as in any other skill, constant practice helps you develop and maintain your competence. The problems presented here provide extra practice to help you in this endeavor.

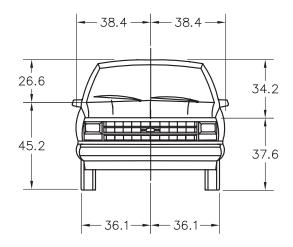
Problem 1: CD Jewel Case

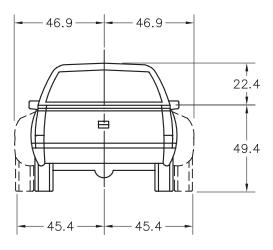
Create the isometric drawing of a CD jewel case. Use the appropriate commands and options to dimension the drawing completely.

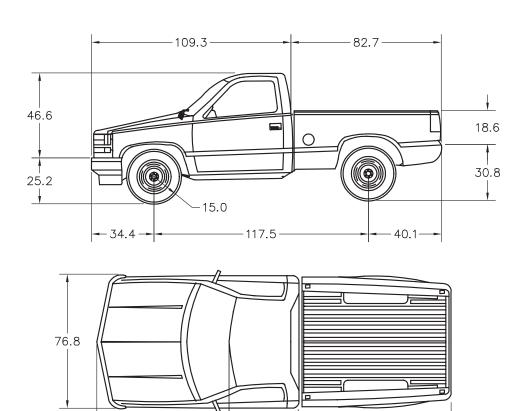
